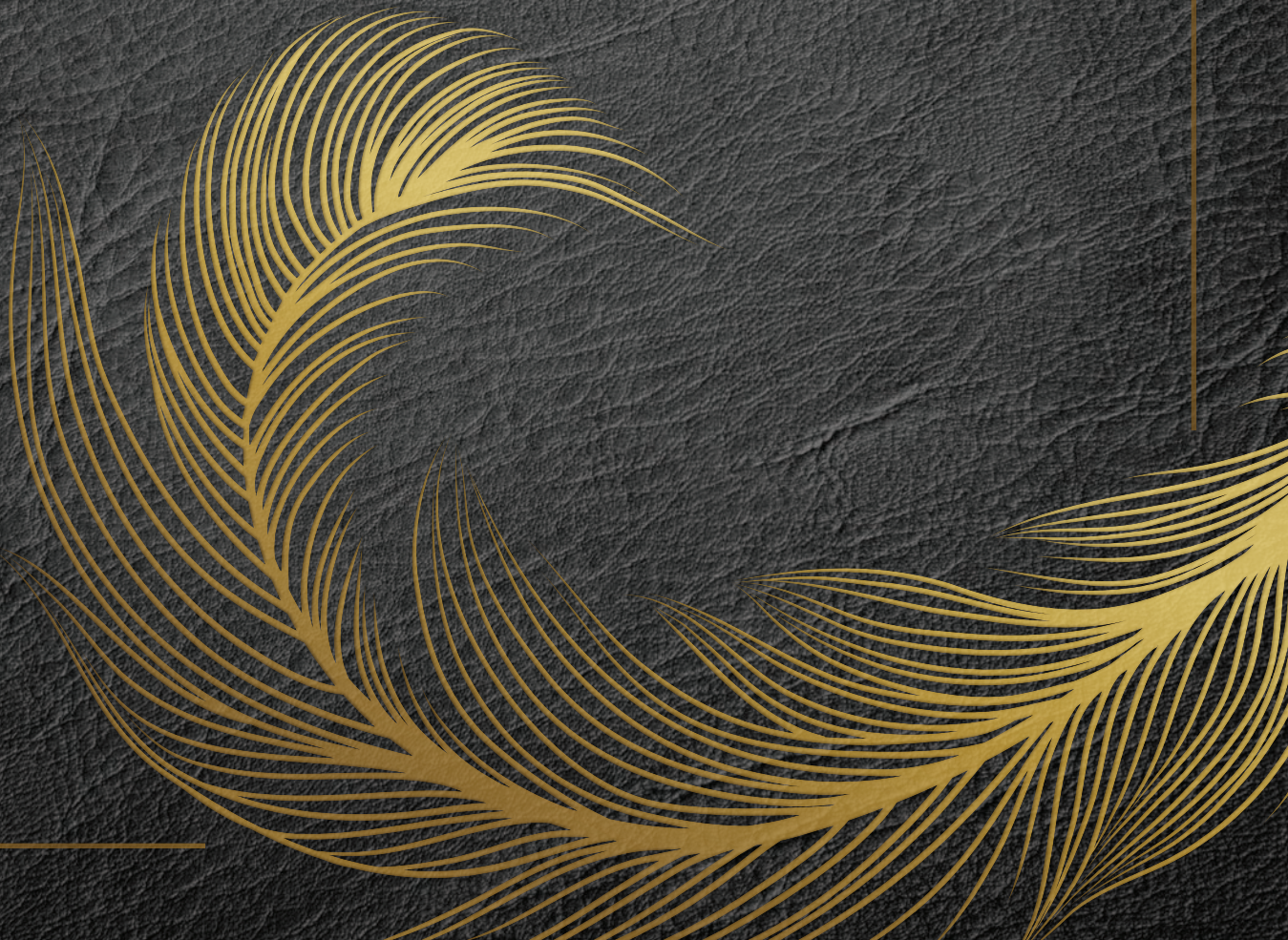

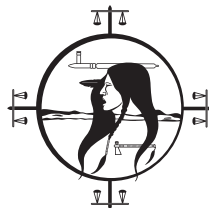

INTRODUCTION

In the years since the amendments to the *Criminal Code*¹ that saw the inclusion of s. 718.2(e), which requires sentencing judges to consider “all available sanctions other than imprisonment that are reasonable in the circumstances ... with particular attention to the circumstances of Aboriginal offenders,” the Supreme Court of Canada (SCC) has affirmed the remedial nature of the provision in *R v Gladue* and most recently in *R v Ipeelee*.² Despite attempts to mitigate the overrepresentation of Indigenous people in Canadian prisons and correctional centres, the trend has continued to worsen in recent years,³ and Indigenous peoples continue to languish in correctional facilities in unprecedented numbers.

R v Ipeelee has provided Canadian courts with much-needed clarification of the Gladue principles underlying s. 718.2(e) and identified several problems that have surfaced in their application. A related hindrance to consideration of all available sanctions has been that there are few community and government resources available to provide alternatives to custodial sentences in the community and/or insufficient awareness about the resources that do exist. Without those options for Indigenous peoples in conflict with the law, defence counsel has had limited ability to point to viable alternatives to custody. Both of these issues are rooted in the lack of time and resources available to defence counsel

to point out available alternatives for their clients when advocating for the consideration of Gladue principles.

THE PURPOSE OF THIS HANDBOOK

The purpose of this handbook is to increase awareness about community and government resources across Saskatchewan that provide rehabilitative alternatives to custodial sentences, particularly for Indigenous peoples. The manual includes information about addictions and mental health services, Alternative Measures and extrajudicial sanctions, counselling services, anger management and other programming.

CLASSIC hopes the handbook will assist defence counsel in pointing to the applicability of Gladue principles while identifying alternative, rehabilitative programming for their clients. The manual may also assist judges, probation officers and parole officers in the identification of government and community-based services for individuals in conflict with the law. The ultimate aim of the manual is to reduce the representation of Indigenous people in the criminal justice system by providing viable programming alternatives that address criminogenic factors and promote healing in the lives of Indigenous people, their families and communities.

A person who is referred and chooses to participate in the program will be asked to admit responsibility for the offence. A meeting is then arranged between the victim, the offender and community members. Each participant is given an opportunity to express their thoughts and feelings and with the assistance of the facilitator, a fair agreement is made. Agreements may involve volunteer work, paying the victim for damages caused, attending counselling or other conditions agreed to by all parties. The process most often leads to restoration of harmony between the victim and offender.

Before starting methadone treatment, it is important for a client to have a physical examination by a doctor. This includes blood work to test for diseases like HIV and Hepatitis C, and liver functions. This is to ensure their body is healthy enough to handle the methadone. The client then sees a methadone-prescribing doctor. The doctor assesses their physical health and starts them on a regulated dose of methadone. The dose is different for every person. The client sees the doctor regularly to reassess their health and change the dose of methadone if needed. The client sees a counsellor to further develop a treatment plan and receive support. They accept walk-ins and a variety of referrals, including court referrals. There is no wait-list. The only cost is that of the methadone prescription, which depends on coverage and varies between people.



APPENDIX A.5 ABORIGINAL COURTWORKER PROGRAM CONTACT LIST

The Saskatchewan Aboriginal Courtworker Program provides important services that assist Aboriginal adults and youth in conflict with the law. Courtworkers help to ensure that Aboriginal people who are alleged to have committed a criminal offence receive fair and just treatment before the courts.

Courtworkers:

- Explain the reason for the charges to the accused
- Provide general information about legal rights and responsibilities
- Help the accused get legal counsel
- Act as a liaison between the accused and the police, defence lawyers, the court or the Crown prosecutor
- Ensure the accused understands all court proceedings
- Translate court proceedings for the accused if he or she is not fluent in English
- Appear with the accused in court

APPENDIX A.6 SGI IMPAIRED DRIVING PROGRAM

SGI Impaired Driving Program

There are 3 types of impaired driving education programs. The program you have to take depends on how many impaired driving offences you have:

- **1st offence – Driving Without Impairment (DWI) Program**
- **2nd offence – Alcohol and Drug Education (ADE) Program**
- **3rd and subsequent offences – Addiction Assessment**

Once you've completed your required impaired driving education program, you may be eligible to get your driving privileges back early with:

- an ignition interlock restricted licence
- an HTB special restricted licence
- a provisional driver's licence

Your eligibility date for early reinstatement and the licence type will be on the letter you received from SGI, either:

- at the time of your roadside suspension, or
- from when you were first convicted.

Driving Without Impaired (DWI) Program

You have to complete the DWI program if your licence is suspended because of your: impaired-driving (drugs and/or alcohol) offences, and/or driving-related *Criminal Code* convictions. The DWI Program is designed to educate you about the serious problems related to impaired driving and help you distinguish and separate the acts of impaired driving. The course includes videos, group discussions and presentations. It has a laid back, friendly atmosphere that encourages group interaction. The cost is \$170 and can be paid at any motor licence issuer and the issuer will give you a DWI receipt. The course takes 16 hours total and is held on Friday evenings, Saturday and Sundays during the day. Your deadline to take the program depends on your offence and whether you're a new or experienced driver.

Alcohol and Drug Education (ADE) Program

You have to complete the ADE Program if your licence is suspended because of your:

- impaired-driving (drugs and/or alcohol) offences, and
- driving-related *Criminal Code* convictions.

The ADE Program is designed to educate you and give you ways to look at your alcohol and drug use and its side effects, including how it impacts your family. Help you learn about the side effects of alcohol, other drugs, and the addiction signs and symptoms. The program will give you information about chemical dependency and how it gets worse, along with steps for recovery. Lastly, it will help you see the need to separate the acts of drinking, drug use, and driving. We have addiction counsellors who facilitate the sessions in a laid back, friendly atmosphere that encourages group interaction. The cost is \$450 and can be paid at any motor licence issuer and the issuer will give you an ADE receipt. The course takes 28 hours and is held over two sessions for two consecutive weekends.

- Weekend 1:
 - Friday (evening)
 - Saturday (full-day)
 - Sunday (full-day)
- Weekend 2:
 - Saturday (full-day)
 - Sunday (full-day)

Addiction Assessment:

You have to take a mandatory addiction assessment if your driver's licence is suspended because of a 3rd (or subsequent) offence for a *Criminal Code* conviction, or roadside suspension. If you're a suspended driver, you can't simply wait until your suspension term is over to get your licence back. If you don't complete the addiction assessment, your driver's licence stays suspended indefinitely. The assessment is done by an addictions counsellor who works with you to come up with a plan just for you. We'll mail you a letter advising you that you need to complete an addictions assessment. The cost and length depend on your individual assessment.

- Private addictions services
- Provincial Mental Health and Addictions Services
- Métis Addiction Council of Saskatchewan Inc.
- National Native Alcohol and Drug Abuse Program (NNADAP)
